

- * 70% of voters live in "<u>landslide</u> precincts" (was 41% in 1992).






1. 2018 Political Geography Favors GOP




Senate: Democrats would need to carry every Clinton state &



* Gender Canyon: 27% of women with a college degree approve of Trump, 70% disapprove. Among men without degrees, 64%/34% (NBC/WSJ).


2. Republicans Can't Count on Trump's Base to Show Up to Vote in 2018



House: Will Pelosi Have the Votes? Depends on the Final Margin in the House












Senate: Heavily Rural, Lopsided Battleground = Dems on Defense



❖ <u>Lopsided</u>: 26 Democratic seats up in 2018, but just 9 for <u>Republicans</u>


Senate: Only 2 **GOP** Seats at Serious Risk, But 2 Potential Upsets
